ACCOMMODATION

Prague and all larger cities in the Czech Republic boast a wide range of furnished and unfurnished housing ranging from centrally-located apartments to spacious villas in leafy suburbs. Many real estate agencies offer relocation services for a charge of one to two months' rent. Once renting a flat there is a charge of two to three months' rent as a deposit. Also, to secure any deal with any rental agency, the written lease agreement is a necessity. The rental prices of residential premises can vary widely depending on the city, location, size, and quality. Apart from paying monthly rent, you will be also charged in addition electricity, heating, water, and garbage. The rent varies depending on size, location and how the apartment is equipped. It can be anything from cca(?) 15000 CZK per month excluding the bills.

SETTING A BANK ACCOUNT

You can open a bank account of your own on condition that you are 18 years old – except for a few specific circumstances. These include opening a student account that can set from 15 years of age in the presence of a statutory representative. MEDICAL CARE

The Czech healthcare system is excellent and affordable and is inspired by the European tradition, founded on public services and financed by predominantly public means. Czech physicians the same quality as in Western European countries. Your health insurance will be covered by an Employer (NIMH). Your family members will need to purchase private health insurance since health insurance is obligatory in our country. The cost could vary from approx. 15000 CZK /year/person for basic coverage. DRIVING IN CR

In general, if you hold a driving license issued by EU country, you can drive in the Czech Republic. If not, some foreign driving licenses can be replaced by the Czech driving license. If it is not possible to replace the driving license and its holder intends to drive vehicles in the Czech Republic, they must take the courses and training in a driving school, pass an examination of professional qualifications to drive motorized vehicles and then apply for the issuance of a driving license. Alternatively a foreign national can drive based on their valid foreign driving license accompanied by an International driving license. HOW TO GET TO NIMH FROM AIRPORT

Prague is the capital city of Czech Republic and is accessible by air. The main city Airport (Vaclav Havel International Airport) is located in the west side of the city.

The NIMH is located in a small suburb of Prague called Klecany, in the north of the city.

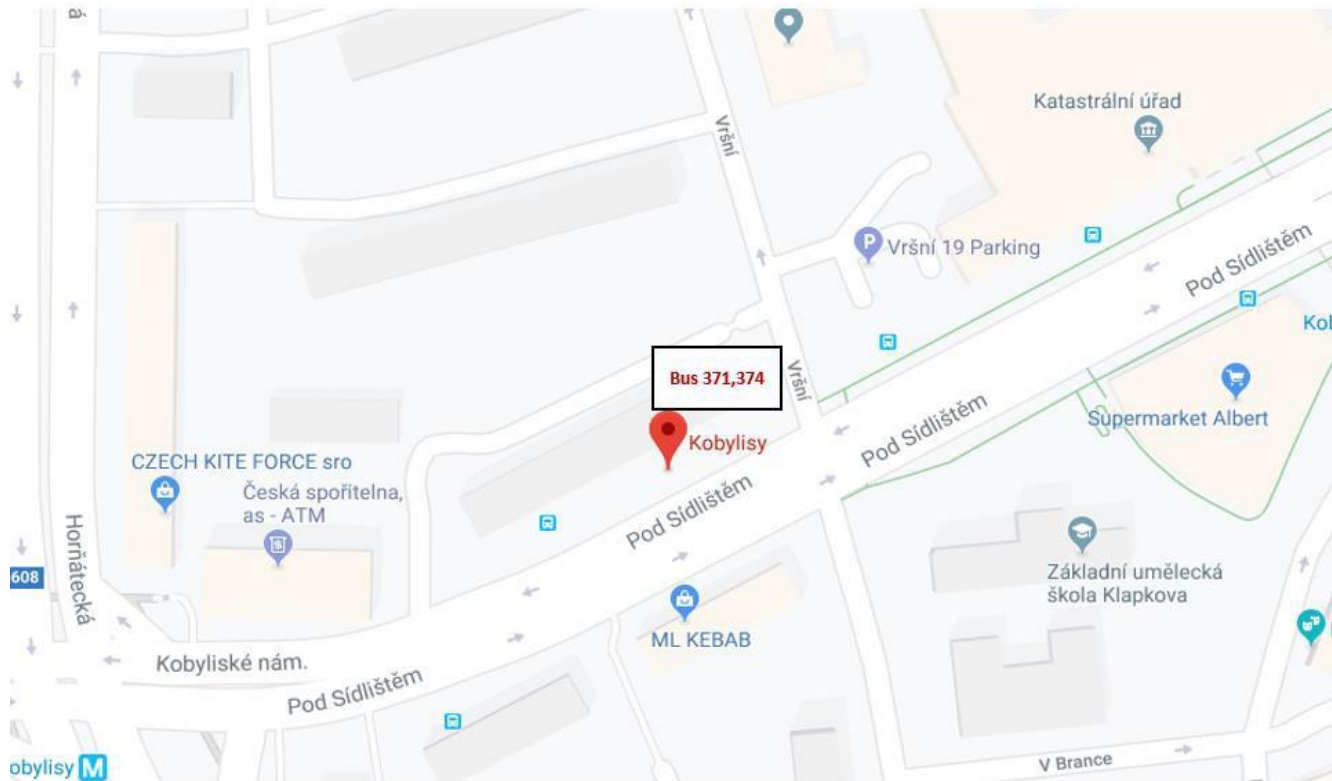
the To reach from the Prague airport to Klecany, you take a bus no. 119 and go to Veleslavín.

From there you take a subway (metro, tube) to Muzeum station (Green Line). At Muzeum, you change the train to the red line to Kobylisy.

From Kobylisy regular busses no. 371, 374 bring you to the bus station Klecany u Hřbitova, 5 minutes walking distance to the NIMH

Public transport from Kobylisy runs at intervals 10 – 15minutes morning and 30 minutes after noon.

BUS SCHEDULE



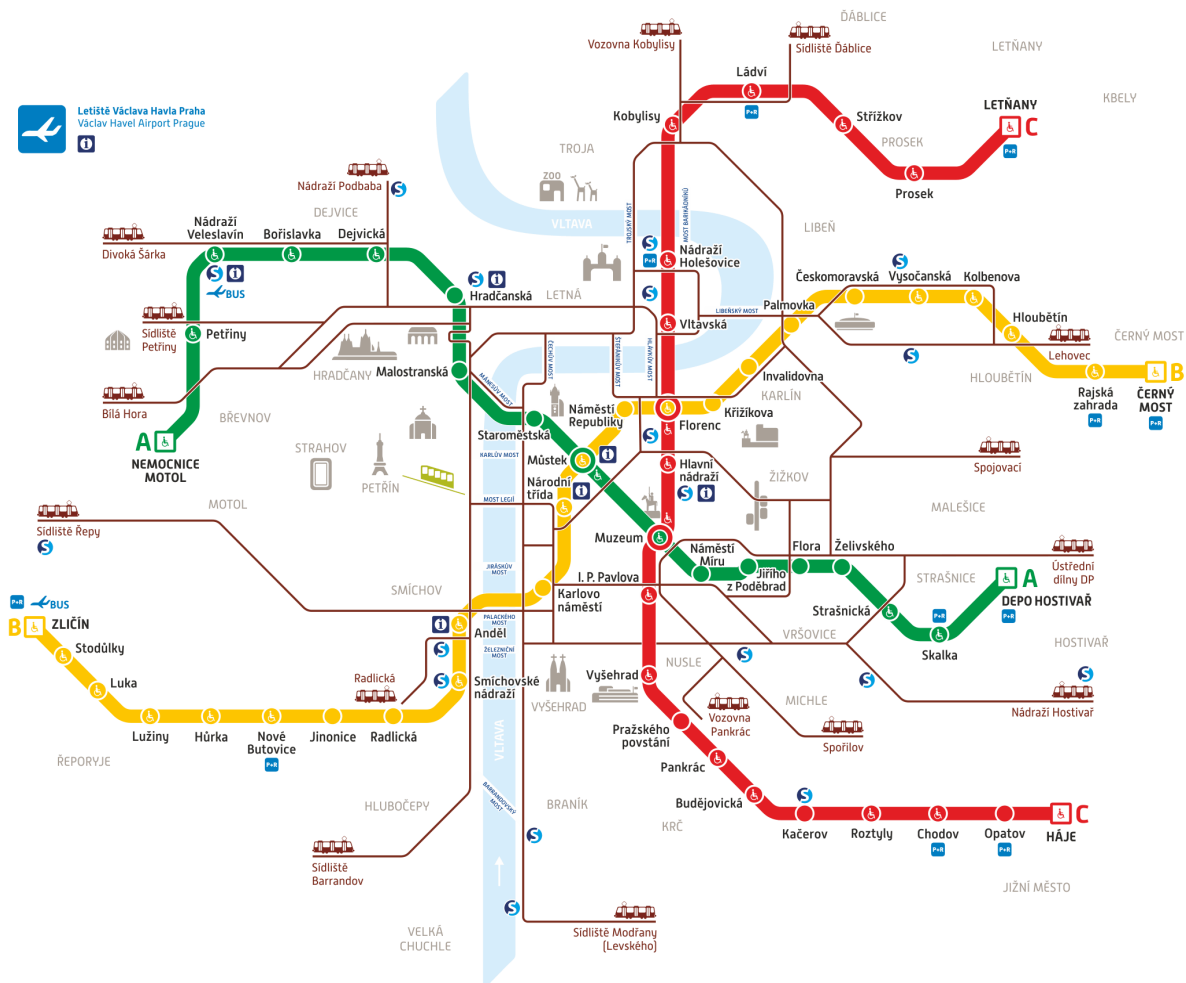
